“REMEMBERING HENRY”

This remarkably inexpensive book with an impressive picture of Henry Miller on the cover, is a befitting tribute to the memory of a great physician and would be an asset to any doctor's collection.

The general standard of production is good and some remarkable contributions have been made by some eminent medical personalities such as introduction by John Walton, and contributions by Lord Cohen, Kurt Sepapira, W.H. Trethowan, J.B. Fasters, Sir George Waller and Marjore White.

The reader will get a true idea of the Man's great personality, character, drive, remarkable sense of humour, intuitive clinical ability and his generosity to people.

My only criticism is that some of his critics who indirectly paid tributes to Professor Henry Miller should have been invited to contribute in this book. However this book rightly deserves to become a must for any medical library and if I may add it will serve as a “dip-in-and enjoy me”.
